If you are traveling this summer and are near South Bend, Indiana, that would a perfect time to make a visit to the Studebaker National Museum (SNM). Studebaker lovers who have visited the Museum will tell you how wonderful it is and worthy of the accreditation by the American Alliance of Museums which recognizes excellence in museum practices from collecting to interpretations. The SNM is one of only three automobile museums to receive this accreditation.

When you visit you will not only see the long-time exhibits but also new ones which include the Studebaker Special #34 Indy race car. Its acquisition has been chronicled in *Turning Wheels* and in the October 2023 *ECHO*. A special new acquisition is a 1932 Rockne 65, a gift to the Museum which helps tell the story of Notre Dame football coach Knute Rockne's affiliation with Studebaker. Another unique addition is a 1900s Water Wagon which is part of the Museum's horse-drawn collection.

# The inventor of the stop sign never learned how to drive.

ew people have had a larger or more positive impact

on the way we drive than William Phelps Eno, sometimes called the "father of traffic safety." The New York City-born Eno — who invented the stop sign around the dawn of the 20th century — once traced the inspiration

for his career to a horse-drawn-

carriage traffic jam he experienced as

a child in Manhattan in 1867: "There



were only about a dozen horses and carriages involved, and all that was needed was a little order to keep the traffic moving," he later wrote. "Yet nobody knew exactly what to do; neither the drivers nor the police knew anything about the control of traffic."

After his father's death in 1898 left him with a multimillion-dollar inheritance, Eno devoted himself to creating a field that didn't otherwise exist: traffic management. He developed the first traffic plans for New York, Paris, and London. In 1921, he founded the Washington, D.C.-based Eno Center for Transportation, a research foundation on multimodal transportation issues that still exists. One thing Eno didn't do, however, is learn how to drive. Perhaps because he had such extensive knowledge of them, Eno distrusted automobiles and preferred riding horses. He died in Connecticut at the age of 86 in 1945 having never driven a car.

#### **GT Hawk Turn Signal Indicators**

Turn signal indicators on the GT Hawks are not only placed in a poor location on the dash, but they blink so dimly that they cannot be seen during the day. I have tried various fixes to solve this problem and have finally come up with a good solution: Replace both light bulbs with #51 Bulbs that are rated for 7.5 volts. These are very bright in a 12- volt system. and since they stay on for a short time, they do not burn out from excessive heat. To avoid looking at your turn signal indicators to determine as to whether or not that they are working, install a Heavy-Duty signal flasher unit that "clicks" on and off.

Note: Be sure that the bulbs are well grounded.

**Dim Brake Lights** — Be sure that they are well grounded and if they continue to be dim or do not come on with a light pressure on the brake pedal, it's time to change the stop light switch. A very simple job, and one that could save your life or that of one that you love.

#### Light Reflection from Automatic Transmission Selector Light

If your Studebaker has an automatic transmission, you can probably see the reflection of the gear selector light off the windshield at night. To cure this bright light, remove the bulb and spray it with green paint. After drying, install and check for brightness. If there is too much paint on the bulb, remove it with steel wool and start over, using less paint.

#### Is the Oil Filter Protecting Your Engine?

Whether the oil filter is protecting your engine or merely deceiving you into false security can be told quickly by feeling the filter. If the engine has been driven enough so that the crankcase is warm to the touch, yet the filter feels cold, oil is not passing through it and the filter should be replaced. If the filter feels as warm as the crankcase, then it is working. Sludge accumulation may clog the filter in high mileage cars before the regular oil changing period.

#### **Power Brake Booster Servicing**

Shop manual calls for the hydrovac power brake booster unit to be serviced once per year or every 24,000 miles with one ounce of Bendix Power Brake Fluid (Vacuum Cylinder Oil), Neatsfoot oil will do very well and it is available at your local shoe store. It is the leather seal on the vacuum piston that you are conditioning and lubricating. If not properly and regularly lubricated the brakes will tend to bind and not release completely. If you are unable to find the mentioned oils, then use hydraulic jack oil.

#### ANOTHER LOOK AT STUDEBAKER SAFETY DEVELOPMENT

By Dan Kuhl

n the early days of automobiling, safety was not a paramount concern. This was noted very clearly in my Rickenbacker article, "An Automobile Worthy of His Name", where Studebaker disparaged Rickenbacker in news ads about Rickenbacker's four wheel brakes that he was putting in a new car he was going to manufacture.

By 1933 Studebaker realized the folly of their earlier thinking and the growing importance of safety in selling their cars. Yes, they had four wheel brakes, with power assist as noted in the February, 1933 issue of the *Studebaker Wheel*, but more importantly they installed safety glass in all windows, the only car in its price class to do so. With the safety glass they were now offering a rubberized steering wheel, a lower center of gravity, and armored steel car bodies.

The importance of the armored body was put on display at the 1933-34 Chicago World's Fair. On display was a

Studebaker that had been twice hurled from the top of a 104 foot cliff into an old quarry without breaking the body and without impairing its ability to proceed under its own power. The Travel and Transport Building at the World's Fair also contained a theatre at the Studebaker exhibit that seated 80 people comfortably in, of all things, a behemoth '34 land Cruiser Sport Coupe, which was part of the new "Year Ahead" Studebaker line.

Studebaker was rebounding from bankruptcy and needed every ploy it could muster to show the public their automobiles were the finest in their price class. Even with the growing competition in the low price field Studebaker continued to demonstrate the importance of safety. Again, I refer to one of my past articles, "Another Feather in His Hat", where Studebaker with the help of Raymond Loewy reached a crescendo with disc brakes on the Avanti. This was a far




