Surprise, Surprise!

The garage door to Mr. Larry Polhill's Private Studebaker and Memorabilia Collection opened during the GCSC SDC Holiday Party on December 14th and a white car drove in. Two gentlemen got out of the car, and one was recognized by the members attending the party – Alice Cooper!

He then started greeting people in a friendly manner, posing for photographs and signing autograph as he walked around the collection.

Mr. Polhill and Alice then sat down with microphones and started answering questions from the members attending the party.

Mr. Cooper's white car with turquoise interior ("because it was so 60's") is a 1963 Avanti that he has owned for 10 years. The Avanti was modified by Kount's Kustoms of Las Vegas, with a high-performance Ford V8 and high-performance fourwheel disc brakes.

Alice said that as a kid, in school, he was an art major, and the one thing he liked about the Avanti was its asymmetric design. He has a collection of cars which includes the following: 1968 Bullit Mustang, '65 Corvette Sting Ray, '34 Ford, Austin-Martin DB11 "engineered in London for Mr. James Bond", '95 NSX, a new SL 22 Mercedes Benz, Dodge Hellcat, new Corvette, 392 Supper Bee Convertible and a small Tesla.

Mr. Cooper, soon to be 77 years old, still performs one hundred concert dates a year in Europe, Australia and USA. He is married to Sheryl, and they have three children. He has been married 48 years and 42 years alcohol and drug free, all these things he contributes to his longevity in music.

Alice also has another band, called the Hollywood Vampires, whose members include Johnny Depp and Joe Perry. He shared the following major moment with the audience. While they were recording in Mr. Depp's studio at his home, Mr. Paul McCarthy of the Beatles fame, stopped to visit. He was seated at the piano and asked them to sing a certain song. Alice, while describing this moment, made faces that one has on their face when meeting their hero. Alice described Paul as the nicest man you can meet and if you invited him to dinner, he would do the dishes. He also described the other Beatles and their personalities.

In 1972, while in Las Vegas he met Elvis at the Hilton. He described his meeting with Elvis and two other people present - Liza Minelli and Chubby Checker. Elvis invited Alice into the kitchen, where he showed him a loaded thirty-eight. Elvis wanted to show him how to take a gun away from someone.
